

Croatia Dalmatia Flotilla



The gentle prevailing northerly winds during the summer months provide some great sailing. The flotilla makes good use of the sheltered coastal harbours and the many safe anchorages amongst the off lying islands. Cruising distances are generally short, so days are set at a leisurely pace.

The Hvar Route sets sail south from the base at Zaton, near Sibenik, out to Rogoznica, Split and then venturing on to Hvar's second largest town of Starigrad with its origins in ancient Greece. It is worth visiting the islands of Brac, Solta, Pakleni, Viz – plenty of choice on your free sail day. The flotilla then joins again in Primosten before sailing back to Zaton.

The Kornati Route sets sail out from Zaton to discover the southern Kornati islands. Start your flotilla with a punch party on the quayside at Prvic Luka, then on to sample food in one of the excellent fish restaurants on the quay in Murter. Sali is located at the northern end of Telascica Bay with a choice of restaurant quays

or mooring buoys. Along the way we visit Piskera at the heart of the Kornati national park. Climb the hill above the mooring as the views are stunning!

A trip up the river to Skradin on your free sailing day is a must see for all. Enjoy an excursion to the Krka waterfalls before returning back to Zaton. A two-week cruise combines both the Southern and Kornati route.
